A BILL

To encourage employer participation in apprenticeship programs.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Apprenticeship Sup-
- 5 port for Small Employers and Teams Act" or the
- 6 "ASSET Act".

1	SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF GRANTS, CONTRACTS, AND CO-
2	OPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.
3	The Administrator of the Office of Apprenticeship of
4	the Department of Labor shall award grants, contracts,
5	or cooperative agreements to eligible entities on a competi-
6	tive basis for the following purposes:
7	(1) Encouraging employer participa-
8	TION.—To encourage employer participation in ap-
9	prenticeship programs—
10	(A) that target individuals with barriers to
11	employment in youth apprenticeship, pre-ap-
12	prenticeship, or apprenticeship programs,
13	prioritizing nontraditional apprenticeship popu-
14	lations such as women, minorities, long-term
15	unemployed, individuals with a disability, indi-
16	viduals with substance abuse issues, veterans,
17	military spouses, individuals experiencing home-
18	lessness, individuals impacted by the criminal or
19	juvenile justice system, and foster and former
20	foster youth;
21	(B) that are in high-need social service-re-
22	lated industries, sectors, or occupations, such as
23	direct care workers and early childhood edu-
24	cators;
25	(C) that target individuals currently or re-
26	cently incarcerated; or

1	(D) among small- and medium-sized em-
2	ployers.
3	(2) In-demand industry sector or occupa-
4	TION GRANTS FOR SMALL- AND MEDIUM-SIZED BUSI-
5	NESSES.—An eligible entity that receives funds
6	under this section shall use such funds to encourage
7	participation of small- and medium-sized businesses
8	in apprenticeship programs, which may include—
9	(A) providing financial assistance to em-
10	ployers to support costs related to the pro-
11	grams, such as training incumbent workers as
12	mentors or employees supervising the on-the-job
13	learning;
14	(B) supporting the cost of related instruc-
15	tion or wages for program participants during
16	related instruction;
17	(C) providing technical assistance to small-
18	and medium-sized businesses on the program
19	registration process and leveraging other avail-
20	able funds to support carrying out such pro-
21	grams; or
22	(D) establishing or expanding partnerships
23	to support program development or expansion,
24	including establishing or expanding industry or

1	sector partnerships to ensure inclusion of small-
2	and medium-sized businesses.
3	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
4	In this Act:
5	(1) APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM.—The term
6	"apprenticeship program" means an apprenticeship
7	registered under the Act of August 16, 1937 (com-
8	monly known as the "National Apprenticeship Act";
9	50 Stat. 664, chapter 663; 29 U.S.C. 50 et seq.).
10	(2) ELIGIBLE ENTITY.—The term "eligible enti-
11	ty" means—
12	(A) a program sponsor;
13	(B) a State workforce development board
14	or State workforce agency, or a local workforce
15	development board or local workforce develop-
16	ment agency;
17	(C) an education and training provider, or
18	a consortium thereof;
19	(D) a State apprenticeship agency;
20	(E) a Indian Tribe or Tribal organization;
21	(F) an industry or sector partnership, a
22	group of employers, a trade association, or a
23	professional association that sponsors an ap-
24	prenticeship program;
25	(G) a Governor;

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1	(H) a labor organization or joint labor
2	management organization; or
3	(I) a qualified intermediary.
