Congresswoman Lori Trahan proudly serves Massachusetts' Third District. Growing up in a working-class family in Lowell, Massachusetts, Lori learned the principles of sacrifice, hard work, and grit. The first in her family to graduate college, Lori earned a scholarship to play Division 1 volleyball at Georgetown University. After college, she joined former Congressman Marty Meehan's staff, working her way up to Chief of Staff. After serving Massachusetts for nearly ten years, Lori moved to the private sector as the only female executive at a tech company and later a co-founder of a women-owned and -operated consulting firm focused on elevating women to leadership positions.

Lori successfully ran for Congress in 2018, motivated to return to public service after seeing the Trump administration's gridlock and lack of accountability. Sworn in alongside a historically diverse class of new members, Lori immediately got to work for the people of the Third District. Now, as a member of the powerful House Committee on Energy and Commerce, Lori is an advocate for Third District residents, working to expand access to affordable, quality health care, end the addiction crisis, tackle climate change, protect kids online, and more.

During her time in Congress, Lori has responded swiftly to crises from the COVID-19 pandemic, when she co-founded the Pandemic Preparedness Caucus, to the overturning of *Roe v. Wade*, when she immediately got to work on behalf of women and health care providers. With every issue she has tackled, she has prioritized the Third District and has secured hundreds of millions of dollars in federal funding for local health centers, infrastructure projects, community organizations, and more.
