## A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of Education to assign a unique numeric identifier to institutions of higher education to facilitate data collection and reporting, and for other purposes.

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Clean Data in Higher
- 5 Education Act of 2019".

## 1SECTION 2. UNIVERSAL UNIQUE NUMERIC DATA IDENTI-2FIER.

3 (a) Assignment of Unique Numeric Identifier REQUIRED.—Not later than 18 months after the date of 4 5 the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Education shall assign a unique numeric identifier to at least each 6 7 campus of each institution of higher education that par-8 ticipates in a program under title IV of the Higher Edu-9 cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1070 et seq.) to be used for reporting and disaggregating data for the purposes of 10 the following: 11

(1) Surveys conducted as a part of the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System
(IPEDS) or any other Federal postsecondary institution data collection effort, as completed in accordance with section 487(a)(17) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1094(a)(17)).

18 (2) Reports required to be filed under section
19 485(f) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
20 U.S.C. 1092(f)).

(3) The electronic exchange of data under section 485B of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
U.S.C. 1092b).

24 (4) Determinations under section 496 of the
25 Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1099b).

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1	(5) Reports filed on the College Navigator
2	website (as defined in section 132 of the Higher
3	Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1015a)).
4	(6) Reports filed on the College Scorecard
5	website of the Department of Education (or any suc-
6	cessor website).
7	(7) To the extent determined to be appropriate
8	by the Secretary, any other data systems of the De-
9	partment of Education that include information on
10	institutions of higher education.
11	(b) Considerations.—In carrying out subsection
12	(a), the Secretary of Education shall—
13	(1) consider the ability to use the unique nu-
14	meric identifier assigned under such subsection to—
15	(A) disaggregate institutions of higher edu-
16	cation by corporate ownership;
17	(B) identify an institution of higher edu-
18	cation with more than one campus; and
19	(C) in the case of institutions of higher
20	education described in subparagraph (B), dis-
21	tinguish between a campus with a specific loca-
22	tion and a distance education program;
23	(2) account for interactions of the unique nu-
24	meric identifier with requirements under title IV of
25	the Higher Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1070 et seq.),

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including by preventing institutional attempts to
 evade such requirements by changing the unique nu meric identifiers associated with the campuses of the
 institution;

5 (3) to the extent practicable, minimize the pa-6 perwork burden on institutions of higher education;

7 (4) create and make public a crosswalk indi8 cating changes in the unique numeric identifiers as9 signed by the Secretary to each campus under sub10 section (a) and the numeric identifiers used by the
11 Department of Education prior to the date on which
12 the Secretary assigns each campus a unique numeric
13 identifier; and

(5) annually create and make public an updated
crosswalk indicating changes in unique numeric
identifiers assigned to campuses, including changes
that result from the establishment of new locations,
the closing of campuses, and changes in ownership
and affiliation.
